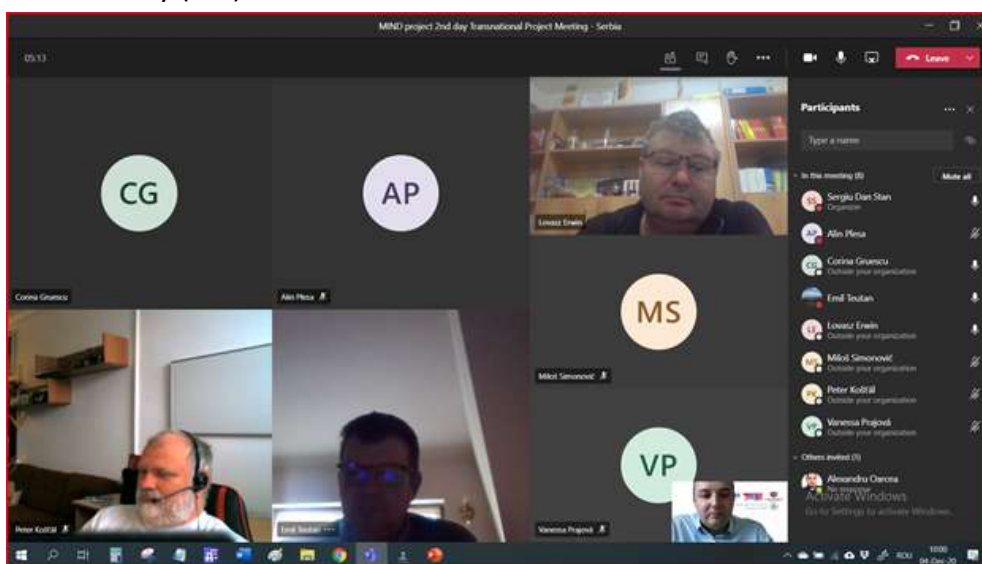




4th TPM – the Transnational project meeting virtually took place in Niš, Serbia on 3 & 4 December 2020

The representatives of the six partners were virtually present via MS teams Platform, in total 13 people from 3 countries: Serbia, Slovakia and Romania.

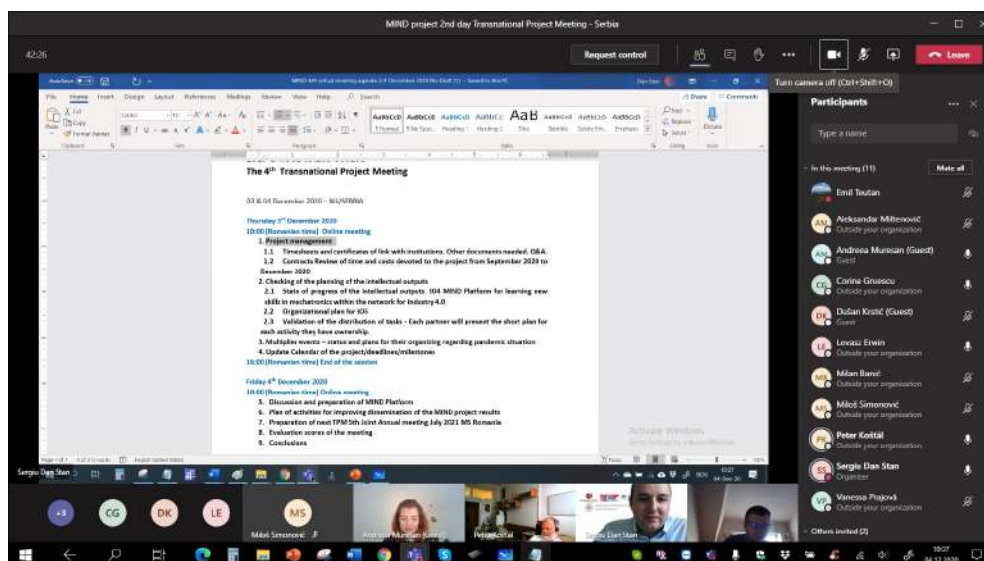
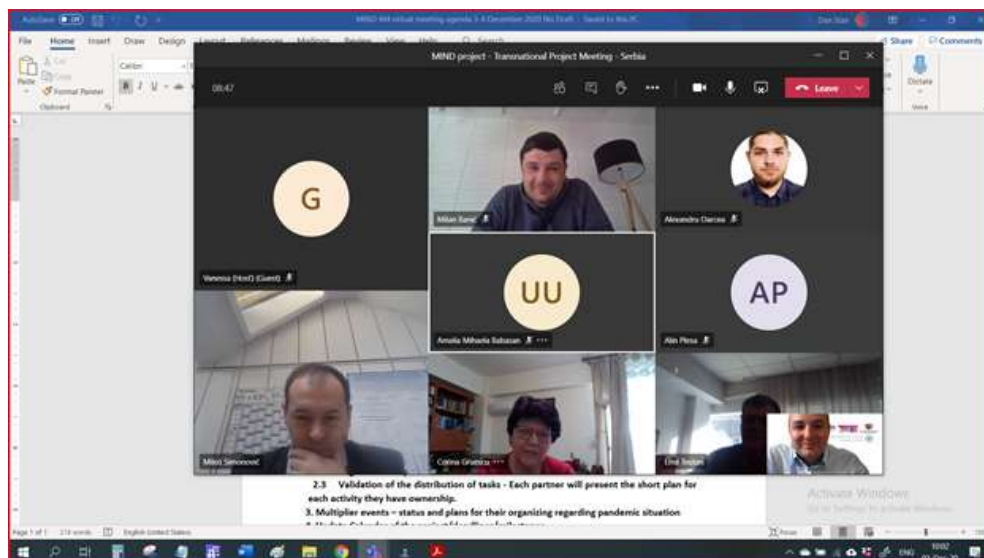
The event was successfully realized following adopted Agenda for the meeting. The short content and joint conclusions of the meeting was presented in Minutes of meeting.
